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National Health Care Decisions Day

April 16 was National Health Care Decisions Day (NHDD) when there is a special, National, emphasis on Advance Care Planning. ACCA has partnered with several organizations over the years including Kaiser Permanente, Relmagine, and Humangood to name a few. This year, we collaborated with the San Francisco Palliative Care Workgroup on April 16 festivities and additional partnership opportunities will also happen in May and June. Workshops are held to help attendees better understand the importance of selecting a health agent, or spokesperson, to speak for you if you cannot speak for yourself and beginning those conversations.

In response to the need for more culturally appropriate Advance Care Planning content, ACCA partnered with the Stupski Foundation and UC Davis School of Nursing to research and develop a workbook that has now been used by hundreds of enrolled participants. The workbook walks participants through three steps: thinking about their wishes, planning their choices, and doing the steps to document their decisions.

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Free Caregiver Trainings



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In December 2023, ACCA was awarded the CalGrows grant through the California Department of Aging. This program seeks to provide free training for the millions of paid and unpaid caregivers providing care across California. ACCA has long recognized the important role that caregivers play in the lives of individuals with chronic, advanced, and serious illnesses and has offered the the Advanced Illness Care Program (AICP) to not only persons needing care, but their caregivers as well.

Now, in partnership with CalGrows, ACCA will expand training to any caregivers across California through a free online training on the ACCA Workbook for Caregivers, which helps caregivers organize their care recipient's needs, ask for support and help, and support their mental health on hard days. The training is scheduled to take place this summer. ACCA has also partnered with Cypress Resilience Project to offer five virtual courses this June and July that will specifically address the mental health needs of caregivers.
